Our mission is to empower the disadvantaged, increase economic opportunity and sustain natural resources.

WHAT WE DO:

Agriculture, Resilience and Water: We partner with communities, businesses and local leaders to develop market-oriented, climate-smart solutions at scale that increase food production and profitability, expand market access, conserve natural resources and build resilient livelihoods.

Clean Energy and Environment: We support healthy natural environments by developing and implementing solutions to protect natural resources, enhance ecosystem services, address climate change, and scale access to clean energy.

Climate Resilience & Adaptation: Global climate needs are urgent and meeting them requires optimized and equitable capital distribution and effective public-private sector collaboration. OUR IMPACT:

Winrock partners closely with the communities we serve to strengthen resilience in the face of food insecurity, conflict, climate change and environmental challenges, social inequality and economic uncertainty. Our most recent annual indicator data tells part of the story.

Winrock's work directly supported nearly 1 million people.

Collaborations with communities, governments and the private sector removed or reduced **nearly 65 million tons of GHGs**.

Winrock's locally led, survivor-centered support for improved human rights **helped to deliver services to more than 6,600 survivors** of trafficking and other forms of exploitation.

Winrock's work in agriculture helped smallholder farmers adapt to a changing climate and improve reliable access to nutritious food, resulting in nearly **2.5 million acres of cropland** being farmed with improved technologies.
