

Your town's Farmer's Association has received training to establish fish ponds in your community leading to a more nutritious and varied diet.

Heavy rains have caused sediment and heavy metals to pollute your water supply.

Heavy rains have come causing chemicals sprayed on nearby cocoa farms to contaminate drinking water supply.





Army worm has infested maize crops leading to a food shortage. Those with secondary forests (mfofo) may be able to make up the loss via bushmeat, snails and crabs.





The Forestry Commission has sent a timber company to harvest naturally occurring timber trees on farms in your community. The company often destroys a portion of the cocoa farm when harvesting.







Swollen shoot virus has infected your farm.





Black pod disease has infected your farm.

There have been conflicts between abunu tenants and landowners in nearby communities, which has spread to your community.







Gold mining has led to mercury poisoning in your community.





Increased tree cover has resulted in more forest food sources.

Heavy rains have resulted in higher rates of malaria.







A land tenure dispute has arisen over your cocoa farm. If you do not have tenure documentation you must pay a lawyer to resolve the dispute.
