Environmental Resource Trust's programs, ACR and ART, are approved by the Council of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), the United Nations' main aviation body, to supply credits for the Pilot Phase (2021-2023), First Phase (2024-2026) and Second Phase (2027-2029) of the Carbon Offsetting and Reduction Scheme for International Aviation (CORSIA). - **Do you purchase or sell carbon credits? If you purchase or sell carbon credits, how do you track the flow of funds?**

Environmental Resources Trust, LLC and its programs (ACR and ART) do not purchase or sell carbon credits. The ACR and ART Registry administrator issues serialized credits on a public registry for CO₂-equivalent denominated emission reduction and removals that are verified for conformance with ACR and ART's standards and methodologies. The ACR and ART registries track carbon programs and projects, as well as the credits issued, retired and canceled.
